

## Quick guide to using lecture hall microphones and a built-in camera for a video conference with Zoom:

--- Instructions for a Windows laptop ---

**Step 1:** Start the media system via the touch panel in the console.

**Step 2:** Turn on the projector as usual and connect your laptop with HDMI or VGA + 3.5mm audio jack. Select the appropriate connection on the touch panel.

**Step 3:** Connect the USB cable labeled “Conference Sound” to your laptop.

**Step 4:** Windows drivers will now be installed automatically.

**Step 5:** Once setup is complete, here's how to integrate the audio from your lecture hall microphones into Zoom.

Select under Settings->Audio->Microphone->

**“Microfon (Scarlett 2i2 USB)”**

So that the sound of online participants can also be heard in the lecture hall:

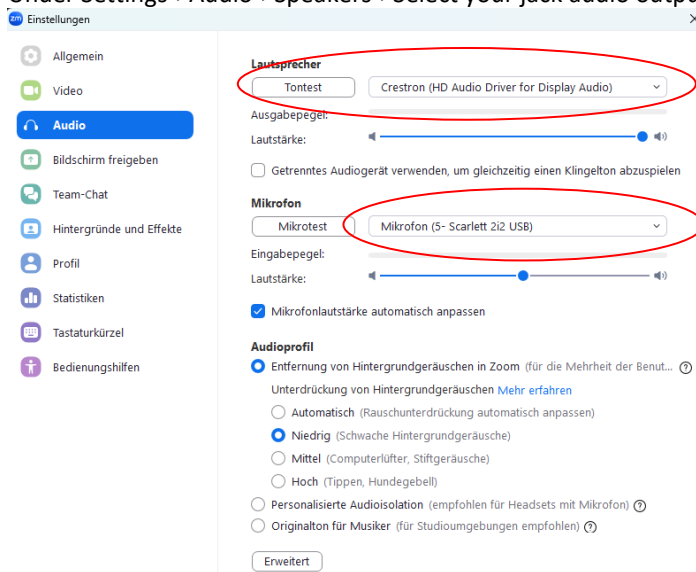
Additionally when using HDMI:

Under Settings->Audio->Speakers->

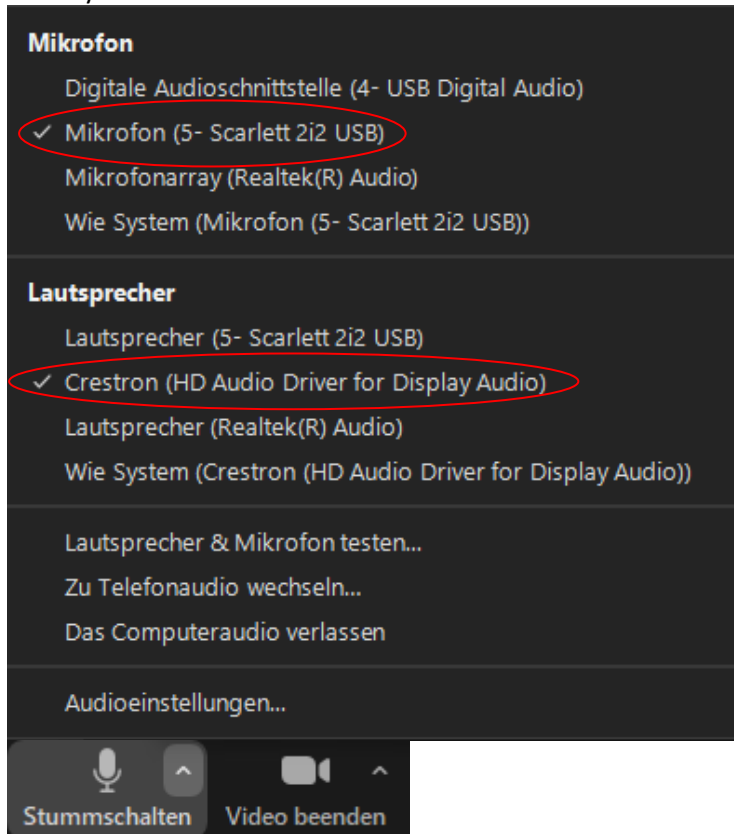
**“Crestron”**

Additionally when using VGA + 3.5mm audio jack:

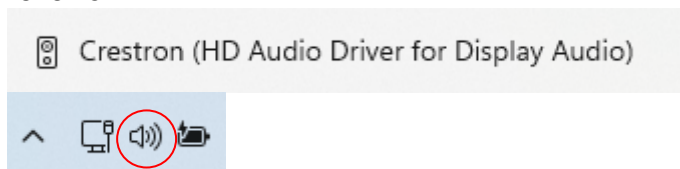
Under Settings->Audio->Speakers->Select your jack audio output



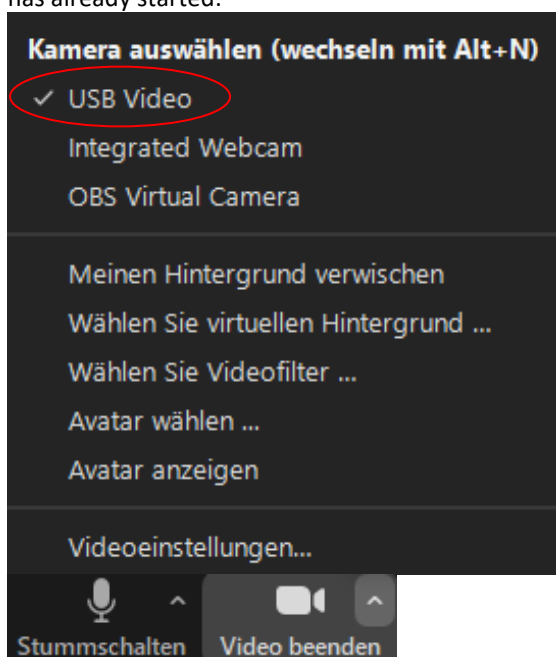
Alternatively, the same settings can be selected via the microphone symbol in a Zoom session that has already started:



If the laptop sound no longer works, the standard output device in Windows can be adjusted as follows:



**Step 6:** To use the camera installed in the lecture hall, select the following via the camera symbol in a Zoom session that has already started:
