- 6. The candidate and the supervisors undertake to:
  - conceive and draft the doctoral project in such a way that the candidate is able to complete the
    dissertation, as is normally the case, within a period of three years. The doctoral period may be
    extended for familial reasons or to account for professional duties and doctoral training
    obligations.
  - jointly review the **status of the dissertation** at regular intervals (at least once a year) and determine at each juncture the next steps in the process. At these meetings, the parties should also discuss possibilities for the candidate to participate in conferences and workshops.
  - consider the **principles of open science**, i.e. discuss aspects of research pre-registration, public access to research data, analysis scripts, materials and open-access publications.
  - discuss ethical aspects with respect to empirical studies and the possibility of review by an
    ethics commission.
  - agree on matters of (co-)authorship in a timely manner. In keeping with the principles of good scientific practice, the ethical principles of the German Psychological Society (Deutsche Gesellschaft für Psychologie (2018). Ethisches Handeln in der psychologischen Forschung. Empfehlungen der Deutschen Gesellschaft für Psychologie für Forschende und Ethikkommissionen. Göttingen: Hogrefe) should serve as orientation.
  - upon submission of the dissertation, jointly complete the personal contribution disclosure form, the declaration documenting open-science activities and the declaration confirming that ethical aspects were discussed during the doctoral process.
- 7. The supervisors undertake to:
  - comment on the exposé, work plans, manuscripts and other written reports produced by the doctoral candidate
  - react promptly to gueries or requests for meetings by the candidate
  - support the candidate in his/her endeavour to obtain doctoral funding
- 8. The doctoral candidate undertakes to:
  - adhere to the working plan and given timetable for the dissertation
  - promptly inform the supervisors if circumstances arise which change the nature or prevent the completion of the dissertation
  - draw up the minutes of the meetings with the supervisors
